

Around school expectations



Movement around school

You are expected to move around the school in a quiet and purposeful manner. This means that you should walk in a calm, dignified, and respectful way. No student should be running, pushing, shouting or acting in a boisterous manner. Some staircases are only one way, please follow the signage.

Mobile devices

Mobile devices and headphones are not allowed inside or outside whilst on the school site. If seen, they will be confiscated and returned at the end of the school day. If this becomes a regular occurrence, individual plans may be put into place to support you in making the right choice.

Assemblies

Students need to walk to assembly in silence and in alphabetical order. Uniforms will be checked before entering the theatre.

Fire alarms

In the event of a fire alarm, students must head to the meeting point on the playground, where they will queue up in alphabetical order with their tutor group. Students should remain silent and move in an orderly manner at all times to ensure everyone is safe and messages can be communicated by staff during an emergency.

Lockdown

In the event of a lockdown (code red), students need to remain in the classroom. Students should follow the directions of their teacher and try to conceal themselves from view by moving away from doors and windows. Students need to wait in silence until they hear the code green signal. If a lockdown occurs during social times, or during a change of lesson, they need to go to the nearest classroom with a teacher. If outside, students need to follow directions from duty staff, move to the school field, and make their way to Riverside Academy.

Social areas

The Avon Valley Way expectations extend to every area of our school, including the canteen and canopy areas.

You must:

- Behave in an appropriate manner and follow staff instructions
- Queue in an orderly manner and show respect to others in the queue
- Sit at a table to eat or take your food outside before eating your food
- Place your bags and coats so that they do not create a tripping hazard
- Leave the tables and floor clear at the end of your meal, putting your rubbish in the bin

You must not:

- Use your phone or headphones anywhere on the school site
- Wear outdoor coats or hoodies inside the building during lesson changeover P1-2 and 3-4

Students can pre-order lunch from the canteen from 8.20. Pre-orders can be collected from the Theatre at lunchtime.



Google Classroom

Here at Avon Valley we use Google Classroom to set homework and assignments to help you with your learning. It may also be used to set work and stream live lessons when there are school closures. Google Classroom is part of the G-Suite range of applications that the school uses from Google.

These include:

- Classroom
- Docs (Google version of Word)
- Sheets (Google version of Excel)
- Slides (Google version of Powerpoint)
- G-Mail

All of these are free to use and are available across PC, Tablet and Mobile Phones (IOS and Android).

When requested, your parents will receive daily or weekly updates via email on work that is set on Google Classroom. When you join the school you will be given your login details and you will be shown how to use the Google platform.

Class Charts

Class Charts allows you to keep track of your achievements, behaviour, scheduled detentions, view your timetable, check your attendance, create wellbeing submissions and view announcements from the school.

Class Charts for students can be accessed via our website, or by our iOS and Android apps.

You will be given your individual Class Charts code by your tutor when you join the school. If you forget your login details, speak to your tutor who can reset them for you.

Uniform

Hair

Hair should be of a suitable, neat style. It should not be excessive and should have a natural colour/tone. Extreme hairstyles or colours, as decided by the school, will not be acceptable in any circumstance.

This will include hair that has had patterns or lines shaved into it and hair cuts of an excessively short nature (such as those where the whole head has been shaved).

Hoodies

Hoodies are not part of our school uniform and must not be worn in the school building.

Students found to be wearing hoodies in the school building will have them confiscated.

Jewellery, nails and makeup

- One pair of earrings are permitted in the lower ear lobe. Small plain studs only
- No other piercings of any kind are permitted including eyebrow, nose, tongue and lip
- No other jewellery of any kind may be worn in our school
- No nail varnish or false / acrylic nails may be worn in our school
- No false eyelashes
- Minimal facial make-up is permitted provided it is subtle and discreet

Wearing our school uniform gives you a sense of belonging and pride. Wearing our uniform also helps everyone to feel part of our community by reducing inequality. In school, or out of school, when you wear our uniform you are an ambassador of the school in the local community. How you behave and communicate with others reflects on you and our school.

The Bridge

Mrs Ogden leads the support in The Bridge. This is a dedicated setting that helps students who might find certain aspects of school challenging.

Attendance and punctuality '80% of success is showing up...on time'



Good attendance and punctuality to school is vital if you are to succeed and reach your full potential. Every day that you are late impacts on your learning time in school. We will monitor your attendance and punctuality very closely to ensure that you arrive to school on time, ready to learn. Arriving to lessons on time is equally as important. Detentions are set for students who are late to their lesson with no valid reason.

We expect you to be in school each day by 8.40 so that your tutor can take the register promptly at 8.45. If you arrive in your tutor base after 8.45, you will be marked as late (L) to school. You will then be issued with a same day break time detention (15 minutes). If you fail to attend the break time detention you will be placed in internal removal for the afternoon (lunchtime and P5, followed by a 30 minute detention after school).

If you are unwell at school you need to inform a member of staff. We will then arrange for you to be assessed by a first aid officer who will decide on the appropriate action.

If you arrive late to school during tutor time, you must head straight to your tutor base.

If you arrive late to school after tutor time has finished, you must sign in at the attendance office.

If you need to leave school for any reason, such as for a medical appointment, you must get a slip signed from your tutor or your house leaders and sign out at the attendance office.

Missing lessons or days at school can have a big impact on your ability to achieve well at school. Poor attendance is linked to a lower chance of high achievement in your GCSEs. The table below outlines the impact poor attendance can have:

Although we want every student to achieve 100% attendance, we understand that there are times when you may be unable to come to school (e.g. due to illness). If this happens it is vital that your parents or carers let the school know by either telephoning the school, emailing absences@avonvalleyschool.uk or reporting your absence on the ClassCharts app.

If at any time you feel that you need support with your attendance or punctuality then you must talk to us. Your teachers, tutor, Heads of Year and Pastoral Leaders are here to support you throughout your time in school.

Good attendance is celebrated at Avon Valley through a variety of rewards for form and year groups as well as individual rewards throughout the year.

Payments

We use a 'cashless' system at Avon Valley, so when your parents or carers need to pay for food at breakfast, break or lunchtime, or for trips, visits or non-uniform days, they can do this by using the Iris Plus Pay.

Your parents will receive information about how to access the Iris Plus Pay online or they can download the app from their app store (Android or iPhone).

When you join the school you will set up a digital fingerprint that you can use to pay for food and drinks in the canteen and canopy.
