Last week's assemblies were delivered by representatives from Rugby Foodbank, who spoke to our students about the role of the foodbank and how it supports people in the community. This coincided with the launch of our foodbank collection in school.

In the build up to Christmas, Rugby Foodbank are planning to create 400 Christmas hampers which will be given out in addition to their usual food parcels. Items that would be included in the hampers include: Christmas puddings, biscuits, chocolates, nuts, stuffing and gravy granules.

Students can drop off donations until Friday 9th December, when our collection will be picked up and put to good use by the Foodbank.

COLLECTING STUDENTS FROM SCHOOL

We would like to remind parents and carers of the protocols for collecting students from the school site.
