MESSAGE FROM MIKE CLANCY -ASSISTANT HEADTEACHER -ATTENDANCE & INCLUSION



This week's focus is on being proud. This is influenced by our wider society, not just school, but is in part built on the environment around us and the respect shown to us and by us to others.

There are many areas of the school we are proud of, such as student performances in the school show, sports results, and our students effort and creativity in lessons. We are always looking for ways to develop further, ensuring our students get the best school experience, and maximising their chances of achieving at GCSE level. As part of 'the AVS way' we encourage students to show pride in being part of our school community, by arriving on time everyday to school and lessons.

By arriving on time, students are showing they value their time in school as well as other students' time by allowing for efficient starts to the learning of all. Arriving on time is also a key life and employability skill. Generally, our students are very good at being punctual. We are aware that moving into Autumn/Winter presents challenges with getting to school on time, due to the changing weather, and we wish to remind students and parents of being prepared for this.

The table below highlights the impact of poor punctuality when 5 minutes is regularly lost from a lesson.
