Sir Mohamed Muktar Jama Farah is British long distance runner. His 10 global championship gold medals (4 Olympic and 6 World titles), make him the most successful male track distance runner ever.

When Mo was 4 years old, his father was killed by a stray mortar round during the Somalia war of independence. At aged 8 he was sent away with his brother to live with his uncle in Djibouti. Shortly after this Mo was brought to the UK by a woman he did not know and was told to use the name Mohamed Farah, taken from another child.

Aged 12, Mo was allowed to start school and he later confided in his PE teacher, who ensured he was fostered and given British citizenship.

Mo is a devout Muslim and often prays before a race. He has stated that " the Qur-an says you must work hard in whatever you do, so I work hard in training and that's got a lot to do with being successful. It doesn't come over night, you have got to train for it and believe in yourself."

In 2013, Mo was named among the 500 most influencial Muslims in the world.

In recognition to his services to athletics and wider society, Mo Farah was officially knighted by the Queen in 2017, making him a Sir.



INTERESTING FACT

Sir Mo has the distinction of being the most successful British track athlete in the history of the modern Olympic Games.

However, when he was young, his dream was to play as a right-winger for Arsenal.

It is also said that his ambition was to become a car mechanic too.
