ATTENDANCE UPDATE

Nationally, post the Covid-19 lock downs, schools now face the challenge of re-engaging and establishing strong attendance and punctuality for all students.

The impact of poor attendance (90% or below) on GCSE outcomes has been researched in depth by the Department for Education. As little as 17 days off school per year (approximately 91% attendance) leads to a drop in GCSE grades by 1 grade.

Sometimes absence can't be helped, but we are asking parents/carers and students to consider whether students need to be off school, or with support could they still attend, giving themselves the best chance to achieve long term.

The launch of the Attendance House Leagues, is part of the recognition and rewards scheme for pupils who have excellent, or improving, attendance. If you have any concerns with your child's ability to attend, please contact your child's Welfare Leader and we will be happy to support.

Reporting absence - please can we remind parents/carers to report student absence daily; this can be done via Class Charts, email or telephone call.

FAMILY SUPPORT

We understand that a lot of families are worried about the impact of the increasing cost of living, and we know that many might struggle to make their incomes stretch to cover the basics. THE AVS Way Attendance Ladder

Excellent attendance. 0 days missed. Students with 100% attedance are 2.2 times more likely to achieve 5 GCSE's at grade 4-9 than those with attendance of 90% or less.

90% Attendance

Attendance is a cause for concern. 19.5 school days have been missed. This is equal to nearly 4 weeks off. The chances of getting 5 GCSE's grade 4-9 are dropping to 34%.

85% Attendance

Attendance is a serious cause for concern. 29 school days have been missed, equal to almost 5 weeks off. The chances of achieving 5 GCSE's at grade 4-9 have dropped below 25%.

Attendance is now a critical concern. This is equal to one day off per week.
