# MESSAGE FROM LAURA BINDLEY ASSISTANT HEADTEACHER

It has been great to welcome our students back to school this week after the much needed half-term break.



I know that Mr Walden wrote to you all last week and outlined our priorities for the remainder of the year. I would like to focus on one of these this week, which is *Behaving Well*. The school's behaviour policy is reviewed every January. The newly updated policy has been approved by the school governors and can be found on our website here.

The main ammendments have been around the use of mobile phones, technology and social media. As a school we understand how important mobile phones have become and the key part they can play in students feeling safe when travelling to and from school. On this basis, we do allow students to have their mobile phones on site, as long as it is turned off and not visible when inside the school building where we expect students to keep mobile phones in their bag or blazer pockets.

We do allow students to use their mobile phones during social time, when outside of the school building. We have now stipulated in the policy that students must not take photos or video footage using their mobile phones or other technology during social time and they must not post onto social media any content that is of the school site, or contains students, or themselves in school uniform.

We hope that parents and carers will see the safeguarding aspect of this change and will support the school, and their child/children, in upholding the school behaviour policy.
